Honours even for under11s

Selby under11s were away again this Sunday at Sandal, Wakefield. Selby fielded two teams against two from Sandal.

The unbeaten Selby went into this fixture with much confidence, though it soon became apparent that Sandal were not going to be an easy victory.

In the first game, Team 1 struggled, but with some good tackling they held Sandal and, with five minutes to go in the second half, it was 3-3.

Selby then faced an onslaught from the Sandal youngsters but, time and time again, Selby valiantly defended their line. With one minute to go, Sandal continued to dominate, but it was Selby who won the game with a clever break, enabling them to walk out the winners, 3-4, in a thrilling contest.

The second game saw Selby lose concentration and give away

some seemingly easy tries to Sandal. But by digging deep and communicating they changed the shape of the match, helped by Captain Benjamin Tosney, who scored a brilliant try from an outrageous dummy, which left Sandal completely non-plussed.

Momentum continued to gather and, with impressive displays from Ben Ward and newcomer Leo Mountain, who scored his debut try for Selby, they staged a heroic comeback to win 7-8. Sadly Team 2 narrowly lost both their games, but notable performances were from Luke Fairfield, William Tahan and William Lonsdale.

This was without doubt the hardest club Selby have faced this season, but they at least walked away with 50% of the spoils and time to regroup before they face Dinnington next weekend.

Great commitment from under12s

Selby under12s welcomed Sandal under12s to Sandhill Lane on Sunday to play four 15 minute games of extremely competitive rugby.

In the opening session both Selby green team and Sandal worked hard on defence, both teams demonstrating good ball retention and recovery skills as they both pushed forward, and were pushed back despite their best efforts to break through, as both teams see-sawed back and forth throughout the session. Sandal eventually broke through to score the only try of the session. Despite continued Selby pressure, the Sandal defence stood firm to hold them back until the end of the first session.

The second game saw Selby red team attack the Sandal line repeatedly. They were held back by a very determined Sandal defensive line, who countered, only to have the ball turned over by Selby to mount another attack. Sandal eventually broke away from the Selby defence to run in a try. Selby countered when Brad Bullock recovered a ball from the breakdown, cutting down the blind side to touch down in the corner. Sandal once again countered, when they intercepted a pass from a Selby

attacking line deep in their own half to run the full length of the field and score.

The third game was no less intense, with both teams demonstrating their tackling and attacking skills. The opening minutes saw Selby in charge, with strong driving in centre field pushing Sandal back into their own half. The ball was quickly moved from the base of the ruck out to Ben White, who passed it out wide to Jake Graham, who evaded the Sandal defence, flanking them to touch down for Selby. Sandal chose to receive the kick off. Selby moved up very quickly to recover the ball and repeat the earlier try, again scored by Jake Graham. Sandal soon countered by breaking the Selby defence to score two tries of their own.

The final game of the set was just as entertaining as the preceding games. Despite some notable attack and defence play from the Selby side, Sandal breached the Selby line four times without reply. It was a good morning of rugby from all the emerging junior players who participated. They demonstrated the core skills of the game in all areas with the all the ability of more mature players, playing with great spirit and commitment.

Experience counts as Ponte prosper

Pontefract RUFC 1st XV 24
Selby RUFC 1st XV 14

A rivalry was rekindled in Yorkshire One on Saturday, with Selby's short visit to promoted Pontefract resuming derby hostilities after the hosts' successful Yorkshire Two campaign in 2017-18. But Selby were promptly taught a lesson in just how to win a game of rugby, writes IAN MARLOW.

With a number of more experienced players missing for various reasons, it was a young and inexperienced Selby team that took to the field - and it showed, as Ponte 'old-manned' them to run out worthy winners.

Playing against the slope and breeze, it was imperative for Selby to try to negate these first half disadvantages with tight, controlled play, keeping hold of possession for as long as possible. Unfortunately, this was beyond them, as a succession of mistakes enabled Pontefract to

camp on their line, where only their own limitations prevented them from crossing for a score. Selby then seemed to have weathered the storm and, after good approach play from Eddie Brown, a penalty was won in front of the sticks to give Selby not only the chance of an unlikely lead, but the Swans' supporters the idea that this was going to be a close, tight game. Unfortunately, and as a portent of their later kicking woes, the kick rebounded off a post and the chance was gone.

The visitors then continued to present Pontefract with a surfeit of ball for the rest of the half as they failed to compete, particularly at the breakdowns, where they were rucked off a number of their own possessions. With the game starting to resemble an attack v defence training drill, and with Swans' fly half Harry Cruise going for the world record in consecutive missed touches, it seemed, only their committed tackling kept the home side at bay. But the constant pressure eventually had to tell, and they eventually crossed for a 7-0 lead after 25

minutes.

With half time looming though, Selby were still well placed to take advantage of the second half conditions, but it all went to pot very quickly as two quick scores were gifted to Ponte to take the score to 19-0, and the game was up.

The second half continued mostly in much the same vein, with Selby's ball control struggles continuing, and it was no surprise when Ponte took advantage with a classy back move off a line out to stretch the lead to 24-0.

Then, with the game seemingly petering out, Selby at last started to string together a series of possessions that had the hosts stretched in defence. After good forward pressure, replacement fly half Scott Hunt, playing well in his first game back after a lengthy injury lay-off, crossed for a well-deserved try after 65 minutes.

Suddenly it was all Selby, as Ponte looked a different side when put under a bit of pressure, and after more enterprising down the back, a certain try back the night was spurned

after a dreadful last pass. However, another move saw winger George Stoker collect a cross-field punt from Hunt to race away, before drawing his man to put centre James Robinson in for a try and 24-14 score.

With Selby now hunting for another score to at least earn a very unlikely losing bonus point, time defeated them - leaving their followers wondering what game they might have watched had they had their game heads on right from the start.

Selby now face bottom placed Old Rishworthians at home on Saturday, and they will be hoping for a much improved performance to get back on track in their league campaign.

High drama at the end, but Senior Colts hold on

In calm but slightly damp conditions, Selby welcomed Roundhegians for their Cup match in the Plate competition. Both teams competed well in the first 15 minutes, but neither were able to gain an advantage.

The home team then started to exert more consistent pressure, and, on the back foot, Roundhegians conceded a penalty on their 22, which was nicely converted by Henry

Bayston. Selby consolidated this period of play with more solid possession, and won another penalty from the same spot with the same result, 6-0.

The visitors then began to look after the ball better, and forced Selby into some terrific defensive tackling, led by captain Harrison Green, with Alex Chapman and Owain Sudron defending particularly strongly too. The home team soaked up the pressure, with only one real scare when Roundhegians got to within five metres of the line. However, the tale of the first half was predominantly one of missed opportunities by both

teams when unable to capitalise on half-chances.

Selby started the second half with much greater intent, ensuring that fast ball from a few nice phases was ultimately converted into points. Max Wotton and Ben Lodge in the pack, and Kyle Turner and Joe Ramsey in the centre combined nicely, before Alex Chapman broke through two attempted tackles to go over in the left corner, 11-0.

They quickly consolidated this lead with a lovely fluid piece of running by full back Ollie Uren, before a perfectly timed offload to Tom Morris on the left wing, who finished sharply.

Henry Bayston converted very nicely from the left; 18-0.

Most of the second half remained at this point, and Selby took their foot off the gas a little, allowing the visitors more ball and more territory, and they continued to press hard, with little reward, until a great mazy run by one of their centres from the half way line to go over in the left corner, 18-5.

There was still time for high drama, and Roundhegians provided it by scoring two more tries in the last five minutes, but were only able to convert one of them, meaning the match finished 18-17.

May we wish a warm welcome to all travelling from the darkness of Rishworth Moor on the edge of Lancashire to the bright open spaces and fields of North Yorkshire and the picturesque town of Selby

The reverend John Watson (1775) first wrote about the Rocking Stone which is to be found on Rishworth Moor, describing it as, “a group of stones, laid, seemingly, one above another, to the height of several yards, and called the Rocking stone.” It is said to affect all who approach it and drive them towards Scammoden Bridge and to hurl themselves off, which is very annoying for motorists on the M62 below.

The rocking stone was long ascribed in local tradition to be a site used by the druids. It was said that in bygone days the great boulder would rock, but this must have been a long time ago as even when Mr Watson described it, he told how “a bass guitar and drums is required on top of a lead guitar to make things really rock “

Close by is the sometimes-dried-up spring known as the Booth Dean Spa, which Watson thought might have been related to whatever ancient rituals occurred here, and said to be related to Dog Hill, where unspeakable practices were observed (particularly on Wednesday nights after 9.30)

Old Rishworthians are former pupils of Rishworth School, which has a long and proud history. It was founded and endowed by John Wheelwright in 1724, and established in a modest but charming old building which is now the Chapel. Today the School is very different. It extends over 130 acres protected by an attractive razor wire fence and six-foot-deep moat, to both prevent incursions by the warlike locals and to ensure that the pupils minds are fully focused. There is also now a wide range of buildings developed to accommodate increasing numbers of pupils.

The sports hall was opened by Joe Royle during his time as manager of Oldham Athletic, a local soccer type club. The sports club (located at Heathfield) was opened by HRH The Princess Royal in June 2007, when she rode to the ceremony across Rishworth Moor, shouting “ If Godiva can do it, so can I “, causing all the assembled guests to keep their eyes firmly to the floor.. The new sports pavilion was opened in May 2011 by rugby player Mark Cueto

Typically, some thirty to forty different clubs and activities take place within the school. from “Project Special Weed” Gardening Club, High Living Gourmet Club, Legal High Science Club, Tinder for Beginners Communications, Debating and Boxing Club, to Adult Film Club and Duke of Edinburgh’s Award are on offer in any given academic year. A fuller list may be found in on the dark web. The whole school, both pupils and staff, is encouraged to take an active part in this wider curriculum, which is regarded as a key ingredient to each student’s personal development. The aim is to ensuring that pupils make the most of their strengths and interests.

Former pupils include well-known names from the Sports and Entertainment industries, such as John Noakes – Blue Peter presenter, Nicholas Connor – Blue Filmmaker, Eric Ponnman – 20th century actor, George Ford – Leicester Tigers and England Rugby Union (and favoured nephew of Eddie Jones), Joe Ford – Leicester Tigers Rugby Union, and Gareth Widdop - St. George Illawarra Dragons and England Rugby League

Selby RUFC 22 – 18 Old Rishworthians RUFC Report by Ian Marlow

Selby took another step towards league safety with a nail biting win against first time visitors Old Rishworthians at Sandhill Lane on Saturday - and spirits were further raised as, with their closest league rivals all losing, it leaves the Swans just one win away from guaranteed Yorkshire One survival.

Selby were expecting a grim forward battle but the unavailability of both Rishworthians' first choice props meant the expected scrum pressure was considerably less grizzly, and Selby actually dominated throughout, but Rishworthians still presented a stern test elsewhere and the match was finely balanced and could have gone either way until the final whistle eventually allowed the Selby support to breathe again.

Rishworthians started strongly and set the pattern for the match from the outset as their young team gained possession and then kept it through numerous phases, testing Selby's defences wide out, until an eventual indiscretion gave them the chance to take the lead from a penalty in front of the posts. Selby replied with possession of their own but with their link up play misfiring, they were reduced to a succession of individual charges that Rishworthians dealt with without too much trouble, before fly half Will Edwards missed with a penalty attempt after 15 minutes.

Selby's dominance at scrum time came to their rescue though as, following a near miss from Rob Taylor; the forwards forced their way over again with big Martin Protheroe emerging with ball in hand. The missed conversion kept it close before Selby contrived to go behind as they failed to deal with an innocuous kick upfield to allow Rishworthians to pick their pockets and scoot away upfield for a converted try. Back came Selby to calm nerves again though as on the stroke of half time they kept their patience to recycle through the phases for Taylor to make amends for his earlier butterfingeryness with a try in the corner to tie the scores.

There then came the first of two pivotal kicking moments in the match as centre Alex Webster's conversion attempt, although resembling the flight of a drunken duck launched from a boot up its backside, crept over from wide out - and with no deductions for style, the extra two points not only regained the half time lead but would prove crucial in the later context of the match.

An early second half injury to big ball carrier Taylor reduced Selby's effectiveness and with the Swans struggling to piece together coherent phases of play the match became mired in midfield. Rishworthians, with their open-side flanker outstanding, always looked lively and only some resolute and sometimes last ditch defending, with Webster and fellow centre Andy Kehoe to the fore, keeping them at bay. It was therefore a massive relief, after Selby had managed to get within range of the Rishworthians line, when hooker Mark Tanner finished off some good team play to cross for a converted try and a two score lead after fifty minutes.

A good penalty from Rishworthians raised tensions again as it brought it back to one score before Webster restored some calm with a penalty in reply for a 22-13 score-line. Selby then set alarm bells clanging pitch-side as they repeatedly failed to clear the return - and Rishworthians took full advantage with a smart try under the sticks to bring them right back into the match. However, crucially, they somehow missed the simple conversion kick meaning the gap was four points instead of two - so, when they were later awarded a very kickable penalty, which would otherwise have won the match, they were forced to kick to touch instead as only a try would retake the lead.

With the clock ticking down in slow motion and the large crowd having already had enough excitement for the day thank you, Selby managed to hang on as Rishworthians threw everything at them - and it was entirely fitting and indicative that the final and crucial turnover as Rishworthians pressed yet again should be pulled off by a combination of Webster and Kehoe, who had both given their all to the Selby defensive cause.

Selby's penultimate match is away at Hullensians on Saturday where a win will almost certainly ensure league survival - but nothing should be taken for granted and Selby will wish to do the job themselves rather than having to rely on results from elsewhere.
